

Vocational colleges expand international dual-degree pathways in logistics and hospitality

China's vocational education system approved 82 new dual-certificate international cooperation programs linking domestic vocational colleges with schools in Singapore, Germany, and UAE, focusing on logistics, hospitality and service management. The goal is to align training with global certification standards and increase job mobility for graduates. (ceaie.edu.cn)

China launches “AI-powered campus governance pilot” across 120 universities

Over 30 leading universities (including Tsinghua, Fudan, and Zhejiang University) formed new internship pipelines with multinational companies in Europe and ASEAN to increase work-integrated learning, enabling students to receive academic credits for overseas practical training and enhance global career readiness. China accelerates “Industry-Education Integration Bases” to support talent pipelines

The National Development and Reform Commission (NDRC) and Ministry of Education jointly approved a new round of industry-education integration demonstration bases, linking universities with key sectors including advanced manufacturing, renewable energy, AI, and life sciences. The initiative prioritizes internships and applied research aimed at addressing talent shortages in strategic industries. (**MOE China**)
