Catering sector sees steady October

The nation's catering sector continued its steady recovery in October, with total revenue rising 3.8% year-on-year, according to the National Bureau of Statistics. Revenue from large-scale catering enterprises also saw growth, up 3.7%. Over the first 10 months of the year, the sector registered a 3.3% increase from the same period last year. **(China Daily)**

Chilean Cherries Delivered to China in 24 Hours

China Eastern Airlines Logistics officially launched its own chartered flights for the new Chilean cherry season this month. Previously, through various channels including externally sourced all-cargo aircraft, it had already transported over 1,100 tons of seasonal cherries to ports in Ezhou, Shanghai, Zhengzhou, Shenzhen, Hefei, Ningbo, and Hong Kong. **(Asiafruit)**

Vietnam's cashew exports to China exceed \$3.77 billion

Vietnam's raw cashew imports have surpassed \$4 billion this year, a three-year high, with the average import price rising by 21%. In the first nine months of this year, Vietnam's cashew exports to the Chinese market increased by 37.4% in volume and 54.1% in value, pushing total exports to over \$3.77 billion. Exports to China accounted for a significant 88.7% of Vietnam's total exports. **(Global information for dried nuts)**

Overview of my country's Agricultural Product Exports from January to September 2025

According to customs statistics, from January to September 2025, Chinese total agricultural product exports reached 74.49 billion USD, a year-on-year increase of 1.4%, showing a slight overall growth trend. Looking at the monthly export figures, July and September saw a return to positive growth, with September's growth rate at 4.5%, indicating a recovery in exports. **(China Chamber of Commerce of Import and Export of Foodstuffs, Native Produce and Animal By-Products)**

Myanmar Macadamia Nuts Arrive in Chinese Market for the First Time

Recently, under the supervision of Wanding Customs, a branch of Kunming Customs, a shipment of 20 tons of Myanmar macadamia nuts successfully cleared customs and entered China through the Wanding Port. This marks the first time Yunnan Province has imported Myanmar macadamia nuts since they received quarantine access in September 2025. **(Ministry of Commerce)**
