China's quantum computer operating system Origin Pilot opens for public download

China has made its self-developed quantum computer operating system Origin Pilot publicly downloadable. Developed by Origin Quantum Computing Technology Co., Ltd. and first launched in 2021, the system supports superconducting, ion trap and neutral atom processors. Deployed on the Origin Wukong series, it enables parallel task processing and automatic qubit calibration, lowering barriers for global developers. **(Xinhua)**

Nvidia secures license for H200 chip sale to China

Nvidia Corp said it has secured a U.S. government license to ship a limited number of H200 chips to customers in China. However, it excluded China data-center revenue from its first-quarter outlook due to regulatory uncertainty. China revenue fell to 19.7 billion USD in the fiscal year ended Jan 25, down from 25 billion USD a year earlier. The company said no revenue has yet been generated from approved shipments. **(China Daily)**

Honor unveils robot phone and humanoid robot at MWC 2026

At Mobile World Congress 2026 (2-5 March, Barcelona), Honor unveiled its Robot Phone featuring a 4DoF (four degrees of freedom) gimbal camera enabling 90° and 180° rotation, AI stabilization and auto-tracking. The company also introduced its Augmented Human Intelligence (AHI) concept and debuted its first consumer humanoid robot, becoming the first smartphone maker to enter the consumer humanoid robotics market. **(BJ News)**

AI-supported services score big in holiday season

During the Spring Festival, Ant Group said Alipay's AI Pay users exceeded 100 million, with over 120 million transactions last month. Fliggy reported ticket bookings up 80 percent year-on-year, while AI-generated travel orders rose eightfold. Average airfares topped 700 yuan (about 97 USD), reflecting strong AI-driven consumer demand. **(China Daily)**

The 2026 Mobile World Congress (2-5 March, Barcelona) opened in Barcelona, Spain. For the first time, a China Pavilion featured China Mobile, China Unicom, Huawei, ZTE, Honor, and Xiaomi, showcasing mobile communications, AI, humanoid robots, foldable phones, smart ports, and autonomous vehicle technologies, highlighting China's innovations in next-generation devices and intelligent solutions. **(Xinhua)**
