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China's west-to-east gas transmission project marks commissioning of third pipeline

On October 30, the third West-to-East Gas Pipeline in China completed joint operation testing and was put into full operation. It runs from Khorgos in Xinjiang to Fuzhou in Fujian, with a total length of 7,378 kilometers and a designed annual gas transmission capacity of 30 billion cubic meters. China has now built a gas transmission network with a total length of more than 20,000 kilometers. **(China Daily)**

CNPC Xinjiang Oilfield celebrates 70th anniversary with milestone

China National Petroleum Corp (CNPC) says Xinjiang Jimsar shale oil demo zone (China's first of 3 such zones) has produced 1.5 million tons this year. The Jimsar demonstration zone boasts an estimated 1 billion tons of shale oil. CNPC's Xinjiang oilfield has produced 470 million tons of crude (over 10 million tons per year for 24 years) and 112.1 billion cubic meters of gas in 70 years. **(China Daily)**

Shengli shale oil development accelerates

The Jiyang Shale Oil National Demonstration Zone of Shengli Oilfield in Shandong Province, relying on independently developed technologies, has shortened the drilling cycle for 6,000-meter-deep wells to 29.5 days, increasing single-well productivity by 30%. It plans to add 80 million tons of proven reserves by 2025 and achieve an annual production capacity of one million tons by 2030. **(Xinhua News)**

The Power of Siberia 1 pipeline is operating at full capacity

In October, the gas transmission volume of the Power of Siberia 1 pipeline continued to rise, and it is expected to reach the maximum design capacity of 38 billion cubic meters per year by the end of the year. In the future, it will be expanded to 44 billion cubic meters per year. The Heihe Port has achieved joint scheduling and equipment compatibility between Chinese and Russian technical personnel. **(People's Daily)**

The new China-Russia natural gas pipeline is progressing rapidly

In October, China, Russia and Mongolia signed a memo for the "Power of Siberia 2" project (50 billion cubic meters/year), connecting China's North China pipeline network via Mongolia, with technical assessments and political consultations completed. Preliminary work on the China-Russia Far East gas pipeline (12 billion cubic meters/year) is essentially done, construction to start once financing is secured. **(Xinhua News)**
